Dear Parishioners,

Last week at Mass I spoke of our general financial situation here at St. Jerome during this pandemic, specifically our collections and "Hand in Hand". Today I want to cover the rest of it.

DSF, although apparently more or less on schedule in the rest of the Archdioceses, is much slower than normal this year. We have not reached 50% paid as of now, and only about 62% in pledges. We are about 480 fewer pledges than last year from parishioners. The goal that is not reached has to be paid by us anyway. This year we have been unable to have 7 second collections for DSF.

The **Ignite Campaign** for the Archdiocese started last spring before Covid, but was put on hold for obvious reasons. The drive will be continued either in the Fall or Spring, depending on things being restored.

All **Second Collections**, including St. Vincent de Paul have been heavily impacted downward as well. The one that did best since the shutdown was Rice Bowl which brought in over \$6,000.00, but even that was a big drop from last year.

Our Annual Fall Festival is off and running with the Raffle having begun and off to a very positive start. It will be a one day event this year, Sunday, September 27 from 9 am to 9 pm, but exactly what we won't be able to do this year is not yet known. Our raffle ticket printer told us we were the first to order raffle tickets this year. Due to the high cost of meat, the menu for dinner will be chicken fried steak or chicken fried chicken for a change this time.

St. Jerome Catholic School will open in the Fall under the direction of a new but very experienced principal, Ms. Jan Krametbauer. She has 34 years of experience in Catholic School education, 11 years of which were here in St. Jerome (before even I came), and 22 years as a successful principal. She is familiar in how to handle school matters in both good times and bad and puts the student's well-being in first priority. There is no one I would rather have in charge of our school in these difficult times.
